Bring Your Transcript

If you are a high school student, college graduate, or have completed college-level math and/or English within the last ten years, bring an unofficial transcript to the Counseling Department. Counselors will use this information to help you choose your classes.

Complete Assessment Test

- If you don’t have an unofficial transcript or have not completed math and/or English within the last ten years, schedule an assessment test. This will help by identifying an accurate placement of your English, math, or ESL skills; and help you register in the best classes for you.
