Legislation passed in 1999 requiring all electricians who work for a C-10 [electrical contractor](#) to be certified by the state of California. Regulations from that legislation were put in place in 2002, setting deadlines for all categories of electricians. To continue to work as an electrician after the deadline has passed a person must be one of the following: certified by having taken and passed the exam or an apprentice in a state approved program or an [electrician trainee](#).” -State of California

Laney offers classes during fall, spring, and summer in the electrical department. The program offers all of the courses mandated by the state plus either a certificate upon completion or an AS (Associate of Science) degree if the general studies courses are completed along with the electrical requirements.

The availability of this newly launched program at Laney College can be of great help to construction, electrical, and renewable industry. Finding qualified employees has always been a challenge and with this certified and approved program employers can hire their employees with confidence.

**Electrical program students must attend a minimum of 150-hours of prescribed electrical course-work per year to retain their trainee status. When they have completed all the coursework they are eligible to take the state certification test.**
