## CSU UPPER DIVISION (JUNIOR) TRANSFER REQUIREMENTS:

- 1. Complete a minimum of 60 transferable semester units with an overall grade point average of "C" (2.0). Nonresidents and those with an F-1 visa need at least a 2.4 GPA.
- Complete at least 30 of those units from the GE courses listed below, including all of Area A and Area B4 (Math) with grades of "C-" or better. <u>NOTE:</u> For some campuses, you may not complete Areas A and B4 during your last semester before enrollment.
- 3. Preferred completion of all lower division major prerequisites (required by most impacted majors).
- 4. No more than 70 semester/105 quarter units are transferable to the CSU system.

**CERTIFICATION:** College of Alameda can provide full certification (completion of requirements in every area) or partial certification (completion of requirements in one or more areas). CSU Certification is not required and is <u>not automatic</u>. Students should request GE certification when asking that their transcript be sent to the CSU of their choice during the final term before transfer. **CERTIFICATION MAY BE DONE ONLY ONCE**.

## (HIGHLY RECOMMENDED) UNITED STATES HISTORY, CONSTITUTION, AND AMERICAN IDEALS: The

American History Institutions CSU graduation requirement may be completed as part of the 9 units required in Area D. It is <u>highly recommended</u> students complete these requirements, as it will meet 4-year, title 5, graduation requirements.

Students must take one 3 unit course in "US HISTORY" <u>AND</u> one 3 unit course in "US (CALIFORNIA) GOVERNMENT" to satisfy the American History and Institutions CSU graduation requirement from the list below.
