### **BACKGROUND / SUMMARY**

In Fall 2019, the Laney College Accreditation team, along with a cross-cutting team of Laney staff (faculty, classified and administrators) began work on the Laney College Institutional Self-Evaluation Report (ISER), which is to be submitted to the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges (ACCJC) late in the Fall 2020 term. To meet the filing deadline, the report must be approved by the Peralta Board of Trustees during the Fall semester as well.

A **First Draft** of the Laney College (Accreditation) Institutional Self Evaluation Report (ISER) was presented as a First Read at the previous Council meeting (8/26/20). Feedback from the Council was solicited/provided.

This **First Read of the Final Draft** of the ISER is being submitted for consideration of the Council at this meeting. The updated draft of the ISER is attached for review.

NOTE: As the document is vetted through the College's Senates, finalization of the document - including loading of evidence where placeholders are indicated and the finalized Table of Contents - will continue.

The ISER report will come to the College Council for consideration 1 additional time as noted below:

### **BACKGROUND / SUMMARY**

It is being recommended to College Council that a standing calendar be set and adopted for all Laney College shared governance committees. The standing calendar would roll over from year to year. For example, the College Council meetings would be set for the 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday of every month, held from 2:00 – 4:00pm, and that would remain the same year after year.

The purpose of the recommendation is to allow for a certain level of consistency in campus governance scheduling. The hope is this will also assist in securing participation in Laney College participatory governance such that committees are staffed in time for the first meeting of the academic year.

In the event that a shared governance committee needs to change their standing meeting time, the request would be submitted to College Council for recommendation to the College President. The new schedule would then be updated in the Participatory Governance Operations Manual (PGOM).

Calling special meetings for strategic reasons would be allowed, but should be communicated to the College community in accordance with the Brown Act.

By having a set schedule, students, staff and faculty will all be able to 1) plan their schedules to allow them to participate in committees of their choice, and 2) will assist the senate presidents and college president (who make the appointments to shared governance committees) to make their appointments to the committees as soon as schedules are set.

Adopting this standing calendar will also allow for 1) constituents to be intentful in planning around their participatory governance activities, and 2) for student and faculty appointments to be made earlier to help ensure fully staffed committee meetings at the beginning of the term. By making this change, the College community is exhibiting how it can identify a barrier to effectiveness and efficiency, and make recommendations for change for continuous improvement.
