# BASIC NEEDS CENTER

#### Our Story:

Beginning in the Spring 2023 semester, Laney College began its creation of the Eagles Nest. Currently, our Basic Needs Center at Laney College supports enrolled students to meet their most basic needs so they can succeed academically. A traditional list of immediate "basic needs" is food, water, shelter, and clothing. Many lists now emphasize the minimum of "basic needs" is not just food, water, clothing and shelter, but also transportation, hygiene, education, employment, and healthcare.

The Laney College Eagles Nest fosters a culture of holistic well-being by helping to eliminate life barriers, such as food, housing, and economic injustice, that may jeopardize students' academic and personal success.

\*\*We aim to eliminate barriers and support students by developing initiatives, streamlining communication with campus partners, and connecting students to campus and community resources.\*\*





# What is CalFresh?

CalFresh is a nutrition assistance program that helps low-income individuals and families buy the food they need (formerly called the Food Stamp Program). CalFresh dollars help stretch a tight food budget and help many people afford to incorporate healthy foods like fruits and vegetables into their diets.

With the help of Rescue Agency we held 7 CalFresh outreach events to Laney students. We assisted **87** students with CalFresh information & applications. Currently working to submit a grant proposal for up to **\$25k** to help with CalFresh outreach for our students.

### Successes:

With the help of our basic needs funding the Eagles Nest was able to provide Laney students with emergency assistance. Throughout the Spring 2023 semester we were able to serve 105 students in total.



#### **Students Served:**

- Clothing Closet: 20
- Emergency grocery cards: 35
- Transporation passes: 50



### Food Services:

We had a HUGE success with our FREE lunch and pantry giveaway. Special thanks to our amazing food services staff and volunteers that helped throughout the Spring semester.

#### Students Served:

- 18,549 meals served
- 5,880 fresh produce boxes
- 6,567 pantry meal kits
