See a Counselor

- Talk to your high school counselor to choose a course or courses that will help you make progress toward your educational and professional goals.

For Admissions



- Go to <https://laney.edu/enroll/> and click Apply Now
- Create an OpenCCC account (If you don't already have one).
- Complete and submit a Laney College application, print out or take a photo of the confirmation page (very important!)
- You will be emailed your Peralta student ID number and password in 24-48 hours.



Complete a Fillable High School Special Enrollment Form

Once you have received your Peralta Student ID Number

- Go to bit.ly/2WOQQv4 to download the High School Special Enrollment Form.
 - * You, your parent/guardian, and your high school counselor must electronically sign/approve the form.
 - * Approvals can be e-signed or typed name will suffice.
 - * Homeschooled students must get approval from their local high school district.



Submit Your Fillable Special Enrollment Form

- Email your approved form to Laneyadmissions@peralta.edu
 - * Pre-requisites for English, Math, and Chemistry will need to be cleared by a Laney counselor before submission.
 - * You can schedule a counseling appointment by calling (510) 464-3152, or through Zoom by visiting <https://laney.edu/counseling/>
 - * Your classes will be added to your schedule within 24-48 business hours.



Student Identification Card
