III. Student Equity Plan 2.0 Presentation (15 Minutes) Gary Albury and Clifton Coleman	 Gary Albury & Clifton Coleman presented the Equity Plan for 2022-2025. The vision of new plan was revised to include COVID challenges students faced, such as scholarships to aid students during the pandemic, with funding coming from areas such as basic needs, mental health, and state funding that aids students. The plan focuses on African Americans and Latinx males because they are included in many metrics Mildred Lewis shared the equity gap during the pandemic due to the lack of child care, which impacted being able to enroll ue to child care and enroll in and study coursework. The website directs students to CCCapply and many issues are via the District. Bala Sampathraj will form a Sub-Committee to fix links and IT-centered issues and assist with help. Nia Ford will assist with gaps and consistent issues. Clifton Coleman shared that suspended applications occur when students return and have applied in the past but never completed the application, which stays in the system but is never processed. Mismatches in data prevents completion and students are not informed of this error. District A & R frontline staff usually streamline minor issues. Bala Sampathraj questions how the issues are divided among District A & R staff. Janelle Tillotson students often wait for a welcome letter but are unsure what to do until it comes, or they never receive it.
