## **The Community Rejuvenation Project**

From President Tammeil Gilkerson:

The Community Rejuvenation Project (CRP), is a pavement to policy organization here in Oakland that cultivates healthy communities through public art, beautification, education and celebration. Through experimental programs that interweave different forms of art and cultural expression, CRP aims to empower the community and celebrate the rich cultural histories here in Oakland. Since 2005, the collective of artists have developed over 200 murals in the Bay Area and have also begun incorporating multimedia and documentary filmmaking to their community engagement work.

In 2013, CRP undertook the Alice Street Mural Project, known as "The Universal Language" mural, that that celebrates Oakland's artistic legacy and contributions. In designing the Alice Street Project mural, CRP interviewed more than 50 culture keepers, local residents and community historians to determine the design of a mural spanning four walls and approximate 10,000 ft. The mural focused on the cultural resiliency of the Chinese and Afro-Diasporic communities that intersected at the location. The mural was completed in June 2015, but three months later CRP was notified that a new condominium development would soon block the view of the existing work.

In order to preserve the rich history of Oakland, CRP began working with Oakland Councilmembers and community leaders to identify a new location to begin the process of creating a new mural in the tradition of The Universal Language mural. Through their work, they identified Laney College's Theater as a possible location.

I would like to invite you to a meeting with CRP on Monday, May 7<sup>th</sup> from 4:00-5:00 pm (in T850) to learn more about their work, the Alice Street Mural, and their vision for partnering with Laney College. Any sort of undertaking of this scope would require lots of input from stakeholders, and I would appreciate your participation and feedback.
