5. Safe Parking Program

See proposal documents in teamwork- "City of Oakland Safe Parking Program" and diagrams

Overview of Oakland homeless shelters, homelessness statistics. Creating sites for safe parking for people living in vehicles.

Temporary/interim Outdoor temporary structures and Safe parking spaces with goal of transitional and affordable housing

Similar to temporary tuff sheds except using autos instead of tuff sheds.

24/7 security, port o potties, showers (delivered on site 2x a week). Food, and housing navigator also provided. Helps prepare documents and connect benefits to homeless services system. Flex funds made available to help overcome barriers to housing.

Goal to get people in to more stable housing and to provide safety and health and wellness. Dumping service provide as well as trash services.

Outcomes improved vs. regular services

- -Repite
- -Flexfunds
- -Onsite housing navigator.

Tuffshed sites-75% success rate of not returning to street.

Also looking in to interfaith council for church parking lot space.

Possibility to accommodate students or instructors

Currently have de facto sites where RVs are being parked. Possibility of offering space to existing community structures.

Tuff sheds installed next to Kaiser currently.

These are emergency/interim measures. Help mitigate impact of black water disposal to storm drains and lake.

These sites are planned for temporary durations.

We should generate questions to follow up with team.

Proposal needs to be submitted to district.

Timeframe looking for ASAP.
