VP Gastis didn't want to make it too complicated, keep it unbiased and factual (5 W's)

Questions to consider:

- Feb 19 at regular DAS meeting we will vote on censorship or no-confidence.
- A large number of faculty know what is going on but don't want to do anything about it (other colleges).
- How can we control who votes...could people vote more than once or for a category they don't belong to?
 - Send to faculty only as we do for elections. secure and only the person who received the email voting link can vote
- Do we want to identify which college you are from?
 - NO because it invites problems
 - Anonymity is necessary

There is no real collegiality on DAS.

- Individual colleges are not confident that they can pursue a collective strategy.
- Most COA people don't know anything because their Senate president likes the status quo.
- District so dysfunctional that a vote of no confidence might not really change anything.

ACCJC is looking at us very carefully. We need to build a faculty organization that really ensures 10+ 1 no matter who the chancellor is. Other colleges are stifling us. This formal movement is very important.
