In no particular order...

Accreditation

The ACCJC organized a first training for Institutional Self-Evaluation Reports (ISERs) on Thursday, February 14. The meeting was for PCCD only and was well attended. Our ISER is due in January 2021.

In the mean time, the District is moving forward with its creation of a five-year fiscal plan, albeit in a rather disorganized manner. The plan is to be submitted to the ACCJC by May 1. In parallel, FCMAT is looking at the District's financial processes and conducting interviews.

Program Review
