d. Rejecting massive class cuts for spring 2020 (Weidenbach)

- Curriculum Committee co-chair Heather Sisneros provided an update on the membership: There has not been much Dean participation and they were voted off; College council said no; the Curriculum Committee wants to update membership; just have one dean as a voting member and will be appointed by the VPI.
- What happens if the VPI cannot attend? He will appoint a dean to vote in his place (so, in theory, there could be two deans at Curriculum Committee), but now a new dean membership with voting rights will be added to the membership; unanimously approved and now back to College Council.
- To be done in order to keep curriculum and assessment at the forefront of campus discussion.
- Senators Quindlen and Corlett made and seconded the motion to endorse this motion. It was unanimously approved.
