The Peralta Community College District prides itself on providing an enriching college experience, which demands a safe and healthy student environment. To facilitate this, we are working on providing different prevention and outreach programs and resources to address sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking.

As part of these different programs, we are offering, and highly encourage you to view, “**Not Anymore**”, an online program regarding the prevention of interpersonal violence created by *Student Success™*. This video-based program discusses the different State and Federal laws regarding interpersonal violence and provides critical information about Consent, Bystander Intervention, Sexual Assault, Dating and Domestic Violence, Stalking, and much more.

**Not Anymore** will help you better understand how vitally important these issues are and what you can do to help make yourself and your campus safer. A great way for you to help is to spread the word and encourage your friends to watch with you.

### **Program Instructions**

*Not Anymore* is available now for you to watch. We highly encourage, and **strongly recommend**, that you take and complete the entire program by **June 30, 2016**.

Step 1: Log on to Not Anymore at: <https://studentsuccess.org/CODE/peralta>

Step 2: Enter your access code: **157223**

Step 3: You will be taken to the *Not Anymore* Account Setup Page. Follow the instructions provided. Remember the email and password you enter, as they will allow you to leave and re-enter the program to complete the program in several sittings if you choose without having to start over. If you run into problems taking or reentering the program, do not start over. Contact us through the HELP button and we will assist you.

There is a Q&A/test at the end of the program and a scoring component. You should target to earn at least 75% to ensure that you understand the program. You will be prompted to retake the test until you achieve this score. The program also will allow you to review the program videos before you retake the post-test.

If you complete the modules with 75% your name will be entered into a prize pool for a \$50 gift card to Trader Joes and the drawing will take place during the second week of July.
