Congress passed the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES) and the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Aid Act (CRRSAA), and the American Rescue Plan (ARP) which include the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF I, II, and III respectively). The HEERF I, II and III Student Portions are meant to assist students who have experienced financial hardship relating to the COVID-19 pandemic.
