VIII. NEW BUSINESS:

1. MidTerm Report by VP opsata. (10mins)

Becky Opsata - VP of instruction. First visit to ASLC. Does lots of work with classes and teachers to make things happen. Is an accreditation liaison officer. Her job is to liaise with creditors and the major creditor ACCSC. CA Hawaii. Members of different places in Pacific. They check if they're following all laws - financial aid, good degrees and certificates, real classes, and rules about classes. Accreditors check to see if they're doing good. Then they're allowed to exist. Financial aid from the government to be given to them. 116 CA CC's. Do peer review teams. Some faculty and administration and staff from different colleges to check if everything's in order. Check out process happens every 7 years. They write what they do for our classes, how we do online education, how we have heat in buildings. Every 7 years - say they're doing a good job or if not, work more. Good and accredited to go. Midterm report. Big report hundreds of pages. Midterm 18 pgs. They're in the middle of doing an 18 page report. Last 3 and ½ years. Next 3 and ½ years. See how they're doing. The midterm report is due January. They are sharing draft with other people. The past 3 ½ years we were very different. Did a big one during covid. Section A - What we've done during the past few years. Distance education. Improved tutoring services & new tutor in A105. Eagle's Nest - Basic Needs Center. First part all new stuff. Then instructional stuff. End - things to keep working on for next 3 ½ years. Can answer any questions we have. President, faculty senate, classified senate and VP Opsata have to sign cover sheet.

FV - What are some changes you've made?

BO - It is now a state law that students can go straight to transferrable math and english classes. We can't require them to take prerequisites. Don't have to take high school algebra to go to college level math. Unlike the past, where several semesters of prerequisites were required. Basic Needs Center is also new. They are also trying to have more online educational resources. On Campus Solutions, icons - low cost or high cost. Some even have dollar amount signs to see costs. Trying to improve students' lives.

JV - Has classes that had no cost textbook. Big motivator for them. Could actually participate in classes without worrying about getting the newest versions of textbooks.

MT - Is in a low cost class. Professor isn't as informative. Does that have to do with the fact it's a low cost class? Meanwhile for her other classes, her teachers who make her buy all materials are more hands-on and take more time. Thinking of retaking the class, although she has a good grade, so it can actually help her with her program.

BO - Finding low cost materials is hard and making sure it's valid. Teachers have to check publishers, fact check, and lots of stuff for the book. Good amount of work to find proper material.

SDC - Knows a student whose main campus is Laney. Cost of class is different when taking it at Laney? Cost of class should be the same if it is the same class. English 5 - Critical Thinking is \$500 more at Merritt.

AI - Is this for international students?

SDC - Yes. Not the same amount. \$500 more.

BO - Here at Laney, students are DACA certified. At merrit, maybe not. Go to Financial Aid Office or Admissions and Records and talk about it..

SDC - Same for every single class.

BO - Something up with Merritt.

SDC - DACA and international students have to pay triple?

MM - It's how they are subsidized in state vs out of state. Out of state pay more.

BO - California tax fares. They've chosen to privilege them by making them pay less than out of state folks.

KS - Is being charged more for being an out of state student at her college.

MM - There is a number of students that a class for the teacher is supposed to have. Students get dropped without any notice right after semester has begun. Is there some way they can be noticed that this class is about to be dropped? Once class is dropped, they have to look for another class.

BO - LatinX and undocumented students went down by 27%/.

MM - LatinX and black students being severely low are an issue in his subcommittee. Planning to help in the subcommittee.

BO - Students that have lowest completion rates are African American students for years. Would love to hear ideas for how we can help make a difference. Umoja helps some students. Upgrade tutoring. College has been trying to work on this for a long time - would love ideas.

MT - Doesn't see resources for black immigrant students, but sees resources for other immigrants. Has met immigrants of African American students. Didn't know they existed. So many programs for many other students. Would be great to target that, especially in Oakland, since there's a huge African dysphoria in Oakland. Nothing Laney did. Would be a good start.

SDC - Same for LatinX. DACA undocumented students' prices are too high. Prices would be better.

FV - Would love Becky to come back again.



We'll be having a session with UCRC. We want to inform students if they don't feel secure applying to FAFSA. They can always apply to Cal Grants or CA Dream Act. Should be spread to students of families to be safe. Trump is actively getting information from students though FAFSA. If they do go through Cal Grant/CA Dream Act, their info is more protected than fafsa. FAFSA can't give them a secure guarantee.

GJ - Does FAFSA give money to undocumented students anyway?

FV - No.

JG - Do we have a plan to inform people through the newsletter?

FV - Erandi Garcia of UCRC will create a forum where students can come in and ask questions. We are aiming to have it next week so students know before finals. We are collaborating and still working on it with UCRC.
