#### National day of protest to stop police brutality presented by Dare to Struggle

- Wants to shed light on police brutality especially the cases that exist in Alameda and Alameda County
- Protests are organized speak outs taken to the streets to symbolize collective action
- Dare to Struggle is requesting support from the Laney student body, ASLC, and individuals
  - o Donations, expanding social media presence, attendance at protests, etc.

#### Discussion

- CC motions, SZ seconds.
- KS Inquires about the resources the organization is providing for its Dare to Struggle chapters on a national level (ex. assistance with printing flyers)
  - Jaime Explains that the national organization is unable to provide sufficient support to each individual chapter because they are focusing on their own campaigns on a national

level so chapters must find ways to support themselves and get their own resources established.

#### **VIII. NEW BUSINESS:**

# 1) Mentorship Program (15 min)

- Peer Mentorship Program presented by Kevin
  - This is a pilot mentorship program designed for college students to better connect with other students, their campus and the resources provided at the college. This mentorship program currently exists in a few other colleges (4-year universities) and they want to expand their reach toward junior colleges. Laney College has been selected to be part of the pilot program and is requested to assist with team recruitment for participants, analyzing outcomes, and the impact of the program.
  - O How it works:
    - Participants will be paired with a mentor/peer to get one-to-one interactions and opportunities to connect and grow together. Students can also request to change peers.

#### Ouestions

- KS Requested information about what would happen in the future in terms of cost of the program if the pilot were successful.
  - Kevin No definitive answer yet since this is the pilot so it is possible costs will become a variable in the future. During this time the program wants to figure out how they can make it more sustainable so that colleges don't have to pay (to be discussed with team).
- CT Questions about ASLC's role and the commitment level for each student
  - Kevin Wants support from ASLC to help with recruitment of around 50 students and work with the Peer Mentorship Program team to examine student body behaviors to edit the program.
    - Commitment: Need to participate in training/orientation so student know how to conduct themselves and the interactions/conversations

- Students go at their own pace in the program and the program assists with finding the right match for each student
- o FV Wants to know the information students will have to share
  - Kevin Contact information and self-disclose parts of their identity
    - Ex. Income level, first generation, major, certificate program, career goals, etc.

#### Discussion

- AI motions to discuss, GJ seconds the motion.
- Board shares concerns about the timing of this program and addressed
  - o Our timing being in the middle of Fall semester
  - o Midterms, Thanksgiving break, finals, and end of fall semester
  - Might lack student interest and presence in the program if program is introduced in the Fall
  - The board leans toward launching the program in the Spring rather than the Fall but are willing to conduct recruitment efforts in the Fall
- AI motions to move this item to next week, GJ seconds the motion.

  - Ayla The club does not have an Instagram but we do have a Discord and so all the club information gets distributed there and we are working on promoting our Discord more.

# 4) Speech & Leadership Proposal Packet - Entertaining Speech Event (6 min)

• The Speech & Leadership Club plans to host a speech event centered around entertaining speeches on October 22<sup>nd</sup> at the Laney Quad and would like to request \$450.00 from ASLC to provide snacks and refreshments. The general student body can participate or they can stop by to listen to the club members perform their speeches.

#### Discussion

- KS motions to discuss, GJ seconds
- KS Wants to better understand the structure of the event and the procedure for how speeches will be carried out
  - Charles Members will go up one by one and there will be a microphone and speakers for the presenter. Then snacks and drinks will be handed out afterwards.
- MT Asks for an estimate of how many students usually engage at these events
  - Charles 10 people usually engage
  - MT Recommends to have the event first then to pass our snacks and refreshments after the event to avoid having people come by just for the food then leave
- Board wants to amend the invoice and cut down the total number of cookies from 100 cookies to 50 cookies and from lemonade that will serve 100 people to serving 50 people.
- Due to timing, the board is unable to approve the proposed invoice and will need to host an emergency meeting to approve an adjusted invoice.
