Held on the Laney Bistro Patio, the event brought together students, faculty, classified professional, and community members for a celebration featuring remarks from Laney and Peralta leadership. Guests also toured the FabLab and Cosmetology Department during afternoon Open Houses showcasing campus revitalization efforts.



These new facilities will expand access to technology, modernize learning and arts spaces, and strengthen Laney's athletics programs—advancing the college's mission of equity, access, and innovation in public education.



Laney Librarian Honored with California Library Hall of Fame Award



Laney College proudly celebrates Shirley A. Coaston, who was officially inducted into the California Library Hall of Fame during the California Library Association Gala on October 24, 2025.

Shirley's recognition honors a lifetime of leadership, mentorship, and advocacy for equity and access in libraries across California and beyond. She has been a trailblazer in the profession—previously receiving the 2020 Trailblazer Award from the Black Caucus of the American Library Association, the organization's highest honor for pioneering contributions.

As an early member of the Northern California Chapter of the California Librarians Black Caucus (CLBC), Shirley played a key role in helping the organization transition into a unified statewide body. She has chaired the CLBC Scholarship Committee for several years and continues to mentor library professionals and

students, fostering diversity and inclusion in the field.

Her induction reflects not only her personal achievements but also Laney College's deep connection to community service, education, and lifelong learning. Shirley's dedication continues to inspire generations of library staff, students, and advocates.

Laney College Helps Power the Bay Area's Clean Energy Future

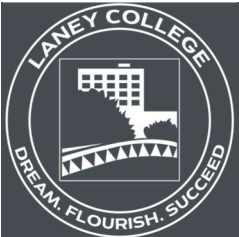


Laney College, in partnership with the Bay Area Community College Consortium (BACCC) and the Electrochemistry Foundry, is leading a new \$160,000 Strong Workforce project to prepare students for careers in battery technology—one of California's fastest-growing clean-energy sectors.

As the fiscal agent, Laney will coordinate regional efforts to develop hands-on curriculum in battery design, safety, testing, and recycling. The project is guided by

Dr. Mark Martin, Regional Director for Advanced Manufacturing and Employer Engagement for the Bay Area Community Colleges, and connects education directly to industry needs through partnerships with ECF and the Volta Foundation.

This initiative positions Laney College as a leader in clean-energy workforce development and strengthens pathways to high-demand technical careers across the Bay Area.



Symposium on Women in Construction Inspires Students to Build Their Future



Laney College's Construction Management Department hosted its first *Symposium on Women in Construction* on September 24, organized by Kelle Lynch McMahon, Department Chair and founder of the Women in Construction program.

The event brought together 64 students, faculty, and industry professionals for an inspiring evening celebrating women's leadership and career pathways in construction.

Sponsored by One Workplace and Whiting & Turner, the symposium featured a panel of accomplished women who shared their career experiences across sectors including healthcare, education, solar power,

residential, and transportation.

Students engaged in networking, connected with employers, and even secured job interviews during the event.

The success of the symposium has already led to plans for a second Women in Construction event in December 2025, further advancing Laney College's commitment to equity, visibility, and opportunity in skilled trades.

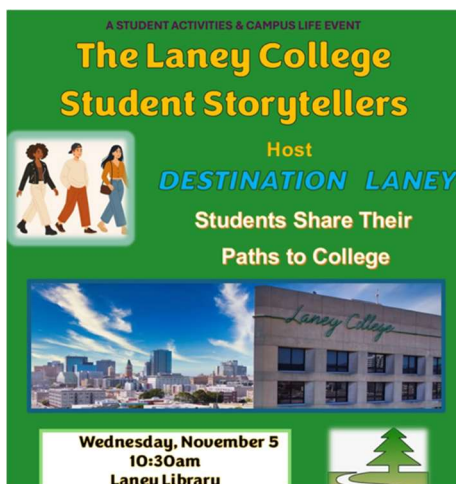
Eagles Day Brings Students Together for Connection & Community

Destination Laney: Student Storytellers Share Their Paths to College

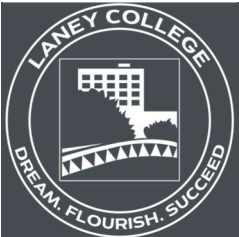

Laney College hosted *OUSD Day* on Thursday, November 13, 2025, welcoming over 150 Oakland Unified School District students to campus for a full day of hands-on learning and exploration. The event introduced students to Laney's Career Technical Education (CTE) pathways and support programs through interactive presentations, campus tours, and a resource fair.

Participants rotated through departments including Architecture, Culinary Arts, Artificial Intelligence, ECT/HVAC, MESA, and the FabLab, gaining exposure to high-demand career fields and learning about financial aid, counseling, and dual enrollment opportunities.

The day began with a warm welcome from President Rebecca Opsata and Dean Lorena Lopez, with coordination led by Kim Gonzalez, Jason Winton, and Raya Zion. Students also participated in a campus scavenger hunt and lunch resource fair, engaging with Laney programs and student services.
