Completion of all the requirements in the California General Education Transfer Curriculum (Cal-GETC) with grades of "C" or better will permit a student to transfer from a California community college to a campus in either the California State University (CSU) or the University of California (UC) system without the need after transfer to take additional lower-division general education courses. (Note exception: Students transferring to some UCs may complete IGETC, but must also meet specific general education requirements of their college.) It should be noted that completion of the Cal-GETC is not a requirement for admission to the CSU or UC system. check with a counselor regarding the difference between minimum admission eligibility requirements and general education.

Associate Degrees for Transfer (AD-Ts) to CSU: student must fulfill Cal-GETC requirement, total of 34 units, for ADT degrees. The Cal-GETC is <u>not advisable</u> for all transfer students. The Cal-GETC is most advantageous for transfers who have not yet decided on a major or campus. Once a student has identified a major, it is important to give priority toward fulfilling all required major preparation courses, particularly in professional or "high unit" majors that select applicants on the basis of satisfaction of lower division major requirements, see ASSIST.org and a counselor for more information.

Restrictions: A student who is initially enrolled at a UC and is returning to the <u>same</u> UC campus (after attending a community college) is considered a "readmit" and <u>cannot</u> use Cal-GETC. However, students who initially enroll at a UC, attend a community college and return to a <u>different</u> UC campus, may be able to use Cal-GETC, but should check with a counselor and/or the campus you wish to attend. This restriction does not apply to students who have taken UC summer session or Extension classes only.

<u>Cal-GETC Certification</u>: Laney College, Peralta Community College District, can grant full certification upon completion of all requirements in each subject-area.

Official transcripts of any coursework completed outside Peralta District must be on file prior or accompany the certification request. Courses taken at other California Community Colleges will be placed in the Cal-GETC area identified by the offering college the term the course was taken. Courses taken at other regionally accredited colleges/universities may be used if the course content meets the Cal-GETC area standards. See a counselor for more information.

Students should request certification when a final transcript is requested to be sent to their choice of UC or CSU (campus where admission has been accepted), the term prior to transfer. The "Request for GE Certification" form is available from a counselor or the Admissions & Records Office and can be filed in the Admissions and Records Office. Once certification is completed student records (transcript) will reflect the certification of Cal-GETC Completion. Students are encouraged to see a counselor by appointment to discuss transfer and the Cal-GETC option as part of an education plan. Counselors are available by appointment through the Counseling Office located on the 3rd Floor, Laney Tower or call (510) 464-3326 or visit Counseling Department website. These requirements are subject to change. See a counselor each semester to stay current.
