Fall semester	August

	December	▶ Submit the concurrent enrollment form for spring semester to Laney College's A&R. ▶ Fall session ends.
Spring semester	January	
	February	▶ Spring classes begin.

	April	▶ Consult your high school counselor for guidance on Fall and Summer concurrent enrollment and course selection.
	May	▶ Submit the concurrent enrollment form for summer and fall semester to Laney College's A&R. ▶ Spring session ends.
Summer semester	June	
	July	▶ The summer semester is 6 weeks long and begins mid-June and ends in late July. ▶

What Is Concurrent Enrollment?

Concurrent enrollment lets high school students take college classes while still in high school. It gives you a head start on college, helps you build confidence, and prepares you for your future success.



Concurrent Enrollment Allows You To:

- **Explore Careers:** Take classes your high school doesn't offer (in-person or online) and earn credits towards an associate degree.
- **Transfer credits to a 4-year college:** Earn college credits toward your bachelor's degree.
- **Find Your Direction:** Discover what you enjoy and start building skills for a career you'll love.

Rita enrolled at Laney College through concurrent enrollment while a freshman in high school. By 11th grade, she had completed all her A-G high school graduation requirements and applied to UC Berkeley, where she was accepted into the College of Environmental Design for Architecture. Confirm with your counselor that your college course meets graduation requirements. Upon completion, the credits will appear on both your high school and college transcripts.

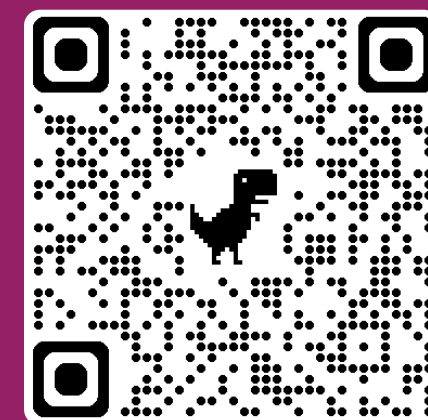
