Even though most of the families come fro Guatemala and the south of Mexico, they do not speak neither Spanish nor English. Their children attend day-cares, elementary schools, and high schools and need to be educated and trained in their own language. Many schools, clinics, hospitals, and legal companies required services of translation and cultural intermediates. This recent wave of Mam immigrants has created great career opportunities for people who get trained on Mama language and culture. Thus we have created this certificate of achievement in Mam language and culture.
