- Introduction to Tutoring: Tutoring skills that prepare you to tutor school-age children or become a paid tutor at Laney College. [1 unit]
- **Health 1:** Provides a broad background and understanding of current problems related to individual and community health. [3 units] or

Health 20: Health and Wellness: Personal Change. [1 unit]

- Math 253: Fundamentals of pre-algebra. [3 units] or Math 250: Arithmetic. [3 units]
- English 201 A/B: Preparation for composition and reading. [4 units]
