Student Success: Develop interventions, strategies to improve student success, and measurement of student outcomes.

Outcomes Assessment: Ensure completion of the assessment cycle for student learning outcomes (SLOs) and program learning outcomes (PLOs).

Accreditation: Ensure a collaborate process to successfully complete the necessary actions that lead to the reaffirmation of Laney College's accreditation on an unconditional (non-warning) status.

Resources: Develop and manage resources (i.e., facilities, technology, personnel and finances) to advance the college educational priorities.
