



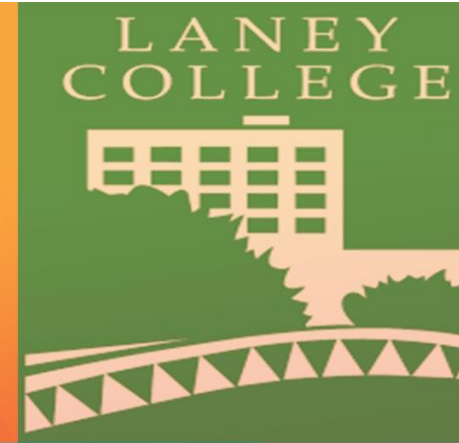

- Students must live within Alameda County
- Students must have a minimum eighth grade reading level

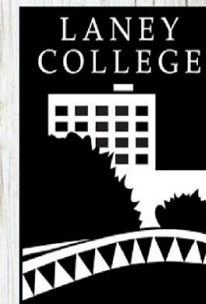
